#### Report of underage AGM

There was a good attendance at the AGM of the Underage Section of the club which was held recently in Batterstown. The meeting was unique in that the trophies for 6 county titles which had been won during 1999 were proudly on display. For the record and for any reader who still is not sure what all these titles were – The Delaney cup for the minor football championship, the under 13 football Division 1 League (Feile), the under 14 football Reserve League, the under 11 Ground Hurling competition, the under 13 hurling "B" championship and the under 14 Hurling "B" rural championship.

In their respective reports outgoing chairman Tom Meyler and outgoing secretary Michael Joyce both reflected on this magnificent achievement and the opportunities that these successes create for further glory for the club in the future. They both highlighted the fact that many clubs build successful senior sides on one or two underage successes. Blackhall Gaels success at underage level in 1999 and in other recent years are giving the club a much wider base on which to build. However they warned there is no room for complacency. Success in the future at any level will not come automatically. The work will still have to be put in at all levels of the club.

In his report the chairman also acknowledged in most appreciative terms the contribution to the club of all teams and their mentors, parents, referees, the grounds committee, those who provided transport, people who assisted with the preparation of jerseys and equipment, provided catering, raised funds, the various county boards and last but not least the generous sponsorship of Tom Bailey and Bovale Developments.

Michael Joyce's last report as secretary of this section again highlighted plenty of thought provoking comment. He called on people at all levels in the club to support such competitions as the Jarlath Carty, the Paddy McHugh and the P&L. He also looked forward to the development of the U 19 football competition which was inaugurated in the Autumn. While cataloguing the underage successes of recent years, the amazing fact that with the exception of the minor hurlers that the club had at least one player on every county team, he warned of what he sees as the most serious issue facing the club based on the results of a survey of the schools in the parish. This survey indicates that in four years time the club may not be in a position to field an under 12 boys football team, because of the decline in numbers. He also thanked all of those who helped him in his role of secretary in 1999 and in previous years and he wished his successor and the club well in the future.

In the discussion that that followed both reports many issues were thrashed out, some in detail. Others were left to the incoming underage committee to focus on particularly on how the club will face up to the challenge of dwindling numbers.

The various officers and selectors were duly elected and are detailed elsewhere in the newsletter.

During the meeting and before the election of a new secretary glowing tributes were paid to Michael Joyce who had a long time ago signalled his intention to pass on 'the mantle' to a new secretary. He was thanked for the quality of his all year round work, of his annual reports and his capacity to generate new ideas for the development of the club. He was wished well in whatever he does and the meeting looked forward to the club tapping into his knowledge and experience.
